

Subject: Discontinuation of Courtesy Copies of E&C Documents

Dear E-filer,

On March 31, 2014, Enforcement and Compliance (E&C) launched Release 3 of ACCESS, which makes business proprietary documents generated by E&C in its antidumping and countervailing duty proceedings available to authorized Lead Attorneys and their Proxy users. **Now that business proprietary documents, public documents and public versions of E&C documents are available in ACCESS, E&C will no longer email courtesy copies of documents in its antidumping and countervailing duty proceedings.** As such, interested parties and their representatives are responsible for downloading all documents released by E&C.

ACCESS will continue to send email notifications at noon and approximately 5:00 p.m. on business days to notify interested parties and their representatives of the availability of E&C documents. Email notifications for BPI documents will be sent to the Lead Attorney on the Administrative Protective Order (APO) Service List for each segment of a proceeding. Email notifications for public documents and public versions will be sent to the lead individual named on the Public Service List. E&C's official APO and Public Service Lists are available [here](#). These email notifications constitute official notice to those interested parties and their representatives that a document has been released by E&C and is available in ACCESS.

An interested party who wishes to participate in a segment of a proceeding and receive ACCESS notifications of public documents and public versions released by E&C must file on the record of that segment a letter entering its appearance and explaining how it qualifies as an interested party.
